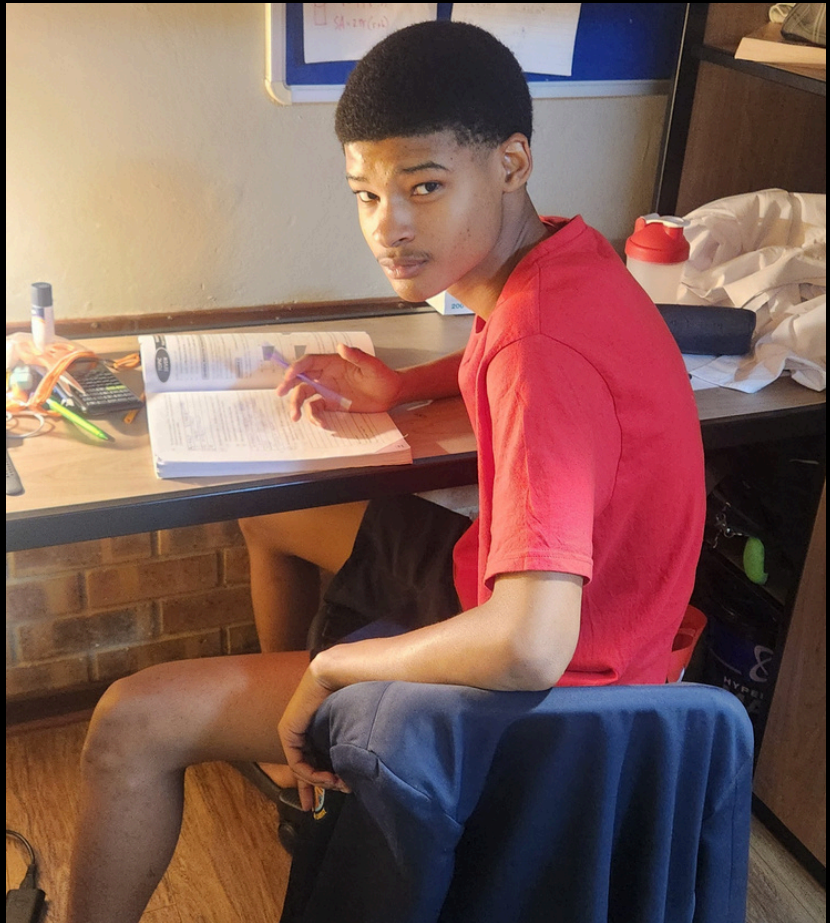
As we honour Mary and the Holy Rosary, may we follow her example of calm strength and bring God’s peace wherever we go.
